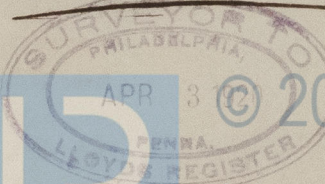
On the 18th of March, 1920, and subsequent dates, all of the Main oil tanks and Fuel oil tanks on the starboard side were cleaned, dried and examined and as far as could be seen, no damage had been sustained.

RECOMMENDED. that the vessel be dry docked for further examination of the bottom at the first convenient opportunity.

The foregoing recommendation was made with a view to restore the vessel to as good and efficient condition as she was in prior to the alleged casualty.
