Nippon Yusen Kaisya, survey the Twin Screw Steamer "SUWA MARU", 10672 tons gross, of Tokyo, on the 26th December, 1940, and subsequently whilst the vessel lay in dry dock at Messrs. Mitsubishi Jukogyo K.K., Yokohama Dock, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated to have been caused by collision with M.V. "OPALLA" in the River Mersey, on the 20th August, 1940, and cutting their anchor chain by her propeller.

Starboard propeller (removable type and bronze blades.)

One blade, marked "L", slightly scored on its leading edge near boss.

To be faired in place and dressed off.

One blade, marked "E", slightly scored on its following edge.

To be dressed off.

Zinc plate on boss missed.

To be renewed.

Guard ring plate bottom half missed.

To be renewed.

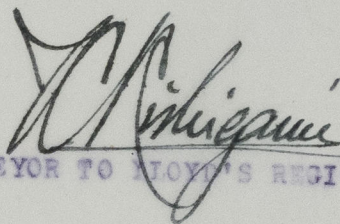

It is further recommended that starboard propeller shaft be drawn in for examination in dry dock and to be refitted in good order and all other new or disturbed work for access to the damage repairs be made in good order.
