Dear Sir:-

Referring to Circular No. 1071 regarding the apportionment of fees received by the Society's Non-Exclusive Surveyors abroad, viz:-
To require the Non-Exclusive Surveyors to charge an inclusive fee for the survey of old vessels and machinery.....and a definite apportionment of it to be credited to the Society as follows:- in cases in which the total amount of the fees received by the Surveyors for the survey of old work does not exceed £300 per annum the Society is to be credited with 10% of the fees, etc.

In my quarterly statement you will note that £74 is charged for old work; In this instance I have debited myself with 10% on that amount, but am at a loss to know if that is supposed to be included; I may state that the principal part of the charge of £74 was for superintending the building of the vessel for the owners.
