We have pleasure in tendering you herewith an application for re-classification survey in respect of the above vessel.

The "Evelyn", we believe, was in class until 1924, when late Owners allowed her to lapse on their entry into the Grimsby Mutual company.

Our Superintending Engineer, Mr. Hepton, reports that your local Chief Surveyor has reported to your office on the condition of bottom, which we trust was quite satisfactory. When on slip, we made improvement by having a good length of bead iron supplied and fixed each side.

In regard to your further requirements, which we shall be pleased to comply with, might we ask that you allow us as much time as possible before suggesting our "stopping" the ship for survey. We have spent a considerable amount of money converting the boat from a "liner" to a trawler, and with brand new gear throughout, new ceiling in fore fishroom, etc: etc: we are anxious to get a few months work out of the ship without loss of fishing time.
