Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letter of the 8th instant, respecting the case of the new S.S. "SUBBANK" (ex "WALL BROOK"), Messrs. The Furnessland Shipbuilding Co., Ltd., No.101 vessel, I have to inform you with regard to the fees chargeable in this case, that as the special duties in connexion with the specifications as a Standard Vessel have been carried out to completion of the vessel, the fees chargeable will be the Standard fees at 1/4 per ton.

In this case therefore, the fee due for the survey of the Hull will be £157: 18: 3, and for the survey of the Machinery £68: 19: 1. You will be good enough to render accounts to the Builders and Engineers accordingly.

The proportion of the fee chargeable for the survey of the boilers is £17: 4: 9, and if Messrs. Douglas & Grant, the Engineers, are not liable for this fee, the account to be rendered to them will be for £51: 14: 4, and the boiler fee of £17: 4: 9 should be claimed from Messrs. Babcock & Wilcox Ltd.

I am, however, writing the Glasgow Office on this point, and requesting them to let you know how the matter stands.
