in the Alexandria Drydock and afloat for repairs on account of heavy weather damage at sea on the 23rd and 24th January 1940. Voyage from Philadelphia to Iquique in ballast via Panama, also alleged damage on voyage Iquique to Cette (France) on account of heavy weather March 1940 and alleged loss of Port bower anchor and sixty fathoms of chain cable when leaving the Port of Cette on the 14th April 1940, bound for Alexandria and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's

Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs

recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and

that I have Recommended that she be continued as at present Classed +100.A.I. Fitted for oil fuel 8-20.F.P. above 150°F. without fresh record of Survey, subject to the Port Bowshell plate E.1 being renewed also the Port Bower anchor and sixty fathoms of chain cable being supplied on board at Owners' first convenient opportunity,

being fit to carry dry and perishable cargo.
