With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the Barque "ALASTOR", I beg to acquaint you that this case has recently been placed before the Committee, in view of the fact that the Fifth Special Survey No. 3, prescribed by the Society's Rules, became due so long ago as May, 1940.

As it would appear the vessel is now laid up, apparently indefinitely, the Committee will not object to her class being retained in the Register Book for the present, on the understanding that the outstanding Survey will be carried out before she is again placed in commission.
