Memorandum of alterations reported since ship was surveyed for assignment of Load Lines in Slaver Dock near Lancaster on 18th July 1937.

One extra bulker scuttle fitted to starboard wing bulker, after end, 17" diam opening, cast iron cover, bayonet joint in efficient condition. Secured by attached Chain.

It is regretted that no mention was made in the original RPTCH. of two 17" diam opening bulker scuttles fitted in forewell deck (1P & 1S) 3'-3" forward of RQ deck front. These are fitted with cast iron covers, screw joint, in efficient condition, secured by attached Chain.

Two extra freeing ports fitted each side in forewell: one 16½" x 12" with one bar, fitted directly above existing 18 x 9½" freeing port, 14" forward of RQD front, the other 20" x 12" with one bar, fitted 11" above deck and 8'-8" forward of RQD front making total area forward of RQD front now 4.27 square feet.

One extra mushroom vent 6½" diam with screw down top fitted to skylights to forward and after accommodation spaces now making two mushrooms on each skylight.

Two hatchways fitted to No 2 hatchway, spacing 6'-1" instead of one as originally proposed and lashing provided for tarpaulins of this hatchway.

Alterations to enable this trawler to be used for the carriage of ordinary cargoes now completed. Please refer to Liverpool RPT. No. 109400.

Freeboard Verification from hereafter.

Gross Tonnage now 348.27.
