Dear Mr. Heck,

In reply to your letter of the 19th ult. with further reference to the case of the safety valves on the above mentioned Vessel, I have to inform you that the valves which were installed on the steam line from the new B. & W. boiler to the main engines were manufactured by the Crane Company and are their Type No. 1121-A, 2½" size. They have a relieving capacity of 190 lbs. pressure ^{at} 11,440 lbs. per hour for each valve, the four valves having a total capacity of 45,760 lbs. of steam per hour. The boiler capacity is 40,000 lbs. per hour.

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The Owners are of opinion that these valves have ample capacity for the purpose for which they are installed.
