With reference to your letter of the 15th ultimo respecting the equipment, I shall be glad to learn how this case now stands.

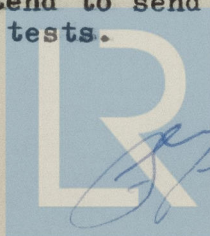

It has not been possible to test the anchors and chains yet, as the testing machines of St. Nazaire, destroyed by bombs in 1943, have not been rebuilt yet.

They were made by "VEILLE" of Le Havre and destined to a boat surveyed by the Bureau Véritas; so the anchors and chains were surveyed, tested and marked by the B.V.

When the tug can be stopped, they intend to send her to Nantes for these tests.
