REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Damage (Grounding)

Vessel examined afloat in loaded condition.

It is stated this vessel touched ground (mud bank) on 15/1/1951 at Odda, while approaching quay at Odda. According to diver's statement the coating of bottom plating is somewhat petched away in way of No.1 hold and no other damage has been found.

Repeated soundings were taken between 15th and 17th January and vessel found tight. Forepeak, and all D.B. Tanks (except No.4 - full of oil & afterpeak - full of water) and bilges have been sounded again on 18th January and vessel found tight.

Bilge pumps examined & tested and found in order.

Special examination of bottom plating next dry docking has been recommended. It is stated the vessel will be dry docked in about 4 months.
