The remarks of the Chief Ship Surveyor are desired on this case for the consideration of the Classing Committee.

("The endorsement to contain a succinct summary of any repairs that have been required and to show the cause or causes of such repairs, and also to bring out clearly any exceptional features in connection with the case, so that the Classing Committee may have all the salient points presented in the endorsement."—Extract from Sub-Committee's Report, 24/5/92.)

It is submitted before this case receives the consideration of the Committee the Surveyors be informed that the Owners' statement that they do not feel disposed to hold the vessel in dry dock at the present time for the purpose of undergoing Survey has been noted.

Under the provisions of Circular No. 1764, this vessel could be generally examined with a view to further postponement of the Special Survey and would only require to be dry docked if the Surveyors considered this to be necessary.

Before the Owners' request for the withdrawal of class be considered, the Surveyors should state for the information of the Committee whether the alternative provisions of Circular No. 1764 have been fully explained to the Owners and whether they are not agreeable to submitting this trawler to a General Examination.
