Dear Sir,

We beg to state we are informed by Mr. Heads, the Superintendent Engineer for the Admiralty Coasting Trade Office that this vessel is about to be sold to Spanish Owners, and that a difficulty has arisen owing to the fact that no records are available to show that freeboards have been assigned to her under British regulations.

Mr. Heads states that the Custom House Authorities have raised no question regarding freeboard certificates while the vessel has been managed on behalf of the Admiralty, and that attention has only now been drawn to the matter in consequence of the projected sale.

In the circumstances he would be glad to learn whether you have any records in this connection, and if not if you would be good enough to forward the necessary instructions to the Society's Surveyors at Middlesbrough, at which port the vessel is now discharging, with a view to a freeboard assignment being now made.

He would be obliged if this matter could be taken in hand as early as possible, and adds that the vessel will probably be placed in dry dock for a short period at Middlesbrough some time next week for the purpose of sighting bottom'

Mr. Heads would also be glad to receive certificates of the Special Survey No. 3 (hull and machinery) held at this port last year.
