Particulars of Casualty

Vessel stranded on Racton Beach on 29 September, 1914, but was reported to have been refloated.

A report however appeared in the Shipping Gazette of 30 March stating that the vessel had been sold by auction to Messrs Harrison & Co for £535.

In reply to enquiries regarding the classification of the vessel the new Owner wrote on 14 April.

"This vessel is ashore at present and we intend salvaging same when ready for repairs. I have no doubt you will have due notice."

On 23 April the Committee decided to defer the case for a month.

Further enquiries were addressed to the new Owner on 17 May but no reply has been received.
