**CORCYRA.**—Bacton, Sept. 29, 8 9 a.m.—  
Coreyra, G.Y. 278, stranded on Bacton beach this morning.  
**CORCYRA.**—Farmouth, March 11.—  
Yesterday the steam trawler Coreyra, of Grimsby, which went ashore at Bacton, in October, was sold under the hammer. She is a steel vessel, built in 1914. At 535/ she was knocked down to Messrs. Harrison and Co. Her stores and outfit were sold separately.

Vessel stranded on Bacton Beach on 29<sup>th</sup> September 1914  
In reply to inquiries the Grimsby Surveyors wrote on 16<sup>th</sup> Oct. last:-  
The Owners state this vessel has been refloated & is now engaged on mine sweeping by the Admiralty  
A report however appeared in the Shipping Gazette of 30<sup>th</sup> March stating that the vessel had been sold by auction to Messrs Harrison & Co. for £535  
In reply to inquiries regarding the classification of the vessel the new Owners write on 14<sup>th</sup> April  
This vessel is ashore at present and we intend salvaging same when ready for repairs. I have no doubt you will have due notice  
It is thought well to submit the circumstances for the Committee's consideration
