the undersigned Surveyor to his Society did at the request of the Owners' Representative, attend on board the S.S. "HELEN OLMSTED" 7312 gross tons of Los Angeles, California, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage stated to have been sustained through the propeller striking a submerged object in Puget Sound on the 25th of May 1928.

For further particulars see log books.

On the 4th of June 1928 while the vessel was lying on the dry dock at the yard of the Los Angeles Shipbuilding & Drydock Corp., Los Angeles Harbor, California, the undersigned made examination and found as follows:-

Two (2) bronze propeller blades bent at the tips. Cement on rest of blades cracked.

It was Recommended that the two bronze blades should be removed, faired and reinstalled and set to pitch as directed.

All studs and nuts to be tested and put in order.

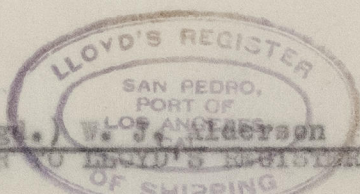
All blade nuts to be recemented.

Cone over propeller nut to be removed and the propeller nut tested and set up and the cone resecured in place.

The above repairs have been satisfactorily carried out and completed.
