Messrs. James Howden & Co. Ltd., attend at their works at Glasgow on the 13th August, 1943 and subsequently for the purpose of inspecting and testing one 36" Dia. S.I. forced draught fan F.1 type engines, cylinders 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", M.F. 2294, M.E. 2541, made to the order of Messrs. C.D. Holmes & Co. Ltd., Hull and intended for their J. 2721.

The steam cylinder was hydraulically tested to 400 pounds per square inch and was found sound and tight at that pressure. Running tests at 645 R.P.M. were witnessed and the engine and fan found satisfactory.
