This vessel is really in wonderful shape, and it is quite evident that the original German owners took very great care of her.

The original working pressure as marked on the boiler was 152 lbs.

The boiler has no stay tubes, and as 100 lbs. is ample for their requirements I have adjusted the safety valves to that amount.

It is intended to sail the "MOSHULU" down to Australia in ballast to take a wheat cargo to Europe.

She will be leaving in September. The sailing date is not yet fixed, but it will be anywhere between the 1st. and 15th., and for this reason I shall be glad if you will arrange to have the freeboards cabled out, so that they may be placed on the vessel and verified in good time.
