
With reference to your letter of the 24th ultimo

BLEY" "NORTHUMBRIA" "PRINCEPS" "REINDEER" "RIBBLE"  
"SANDRINGHAM" "THUNDERSTONE" "VERBENA" "VESPER"  
"WALDORF" and "XANIA".

"LORD AIREDALE":- The Owners state they have  
received an intimation from the Government within the last three
