Nature of Survey

The S.S.No.1, due 2.20, was partly held in London in July 1920

The stern frame, repaired by electric welding in November 1919, required to be specially examined at the next dry docking.

The London Surveyors recommended in April last that some indented shell plating and defective riveting be dealt with and the stern frame renewed.

The Hull Surveyors now report the vessel placed in dry dock, bottom cleaned and coated.

The stern frame has been renewed together with 5 adjoining shell plates on each side, a number of shell rivets renewed and the caulking overhauled.

It was not considered necessary to deal with the indented plating.

The S.S.No.1 has been completed by the examination of the bunkers and testing of the tank in way.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 8.21 and notation of S.S.Lon.No.1-20, as recommended, without special condition.
