Dear Mr. Cocks,

Reverting to your letter of the 5th and mine of the 17th instant regarding the new Motor Tanker "EMBANETT", I think it well to let you know that two Senior Surveyors from this Office took the opportunity of visiting the vessel on the 19th instant while she lay afloat in the River Thames.

She was loaded with oil at the time, so that no internal examination could be made, but from a general inspection of the ship so far as practicable the workmanship appeared to be sound and good, and the Surveyors were quite satisfied.

Also it was stated by the Captain that the engines had worked quite well, and that there had been no stoppage during the run from Batoum to London.

As you say that this is the first Ocean-going Tanker built in Russia, I am pleased to be able to congratulate both the Shipowners, the Shipbuilders and yourself upon turning out such a good job.
