Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the due receipt of your letter of the 27th ultimo respecting the steamer "FRANCUNION V" and note that this vessel is not laid up at Algiers, but is being used as a depot ship for the storage of oil for bunkering purposes, and further, that it has been decided after due consideration, not to maintain her classification in the Society's Register Book.

The case has been submitted for the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today, and I am directed to acquaint you that, in the circumstances, instructions have been given for this vessel's character to be withdrawn from the Register Book and Three Dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal of Class at Owners' request.
