We have forwarded to-day the first entry reports on a floating crane barge built at the Werf Gusto (Firma A.F.Smulders); report No. 25839.

The report on the electric equipment has also been forwarded but on this report we have not yet entered the amount of the fee as in this particular case we did not deal with the construction of the crane fitted on this pontoon. The winches in connexion with the crane are electric driven and the total capacity of generators is 126 kilowatt, which would give a fee of F. 375.60 according to the Rules. You will note that 7 visits have been paid on the electrical equipment and I am of opinion that the amount to be charged in this instance might be considered rather high by the Builders.

Before rendering our account to them I shall be very pleased if you will kindly look into this case and state the amount which might be charged in this particular case.

Please enter the amount arrived at on the report.
