Dear Sir,

With reference to your visit to Honolulu in connexion with the damage to the steamer "VIRGINIA BOLLAR" stated to have been caused by heavy weather in February last, your official report No. 23956 and copy of damage report, dated 21st April, have been read with much interest, and it is noted that the temporary repairs effected at Honolulu were such as, in your opinion, to enable the steamer to proceed on her voyage to the Far East and to return thence to New York for permanent repairs.

It is suggested that when the vessel comes under the survey of the New York Surveyors in connexion with the permanent repairs, all particulars of the loading of the steamer at the time the damage was sustained should be obtained, if this is possible, and I shall be glad if you will kindly take the necessary steps to this end.
