Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the four-masted Bk. "DAYLIGHT", I am directed to acquaint you that the Committee have had the case of this vessel before them, together with a letter received from the Society's Surveyor at San Francisco, from which it appears that she has now been converted into a towing barge and that it is not your desire to continue the Society's classification.

In the circumstances, and in view of the fact that the Second Special Survey No.2 became due so long ago as March 1922, the Committee have decided to expunge the class from the Register Book with a red line.

I have to add that in view of the withdrawal of this vessel's class the record of the freeboard assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draught, will also be withdrawn, and the freeboard certificate is thereby cancelled and should be returned to this Office.
