the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners, attend on board the Single Screw Steamer "TIHUKU MARU" 5857 tons gross, of Hasidate, on the 6th May, 1940, whilst the vessel lay, afloat, in Yokohama Harbour, for the purpose of examining the Anchors, Chain Cables, Windlass, and other Mooring Gear, prior to the vessel's departure for Christmas Island, to load cargo.

The port and starboard bower anchors, the spare bower anchor, and the stream anchor were examined, found in good condition, and in accordance with the Society's requirements.

The vessel is equipped with 270 fathoms of $2\frac{3}{16}$ " stud link chain cable in accordance with the Society's requirements, 135 fathoms in each hawse pipe, and the stream chain, towline, and hawsers and warps were also found to be in satisfactory condition.

The steam-driven windlass was examined under working condition while the port chain cable and anchor was run out, the starboard chain cable which was attached to No. 14 buoy, also run out afterwards anchor and cable hove in, both separately and simultaneously, and found to be in satisfactory working condition. The cable lifters, brakes, and stoppers were
