Cables: Single, twin, concentric, or multicore are the cables insulated and protected as per Tables IV, V, XI or XIII of the Rules **Yes**
Fall of Pressure, state maximum between bus bars and any point of the installation under maximum load $\frac{2}{3} V. + \frac{3}{5} P. \text{ per cent for lighting power}$ **Yes**

 are any fittings placed in spaces where inflammable or explosive dust or gases are liable to be present, if so, how are they protected **Lamps**
