Sir,

In reply to your letter of yesterday respecting the fees on the machinery S.S. " La Platense " I beg to say that I did not know that the first entry fee had already been charged to Messrs Crabtree, neither did I know that your London account had been left unpaid, the £ 62,40 deposited in this Office were meant to cover the first entry fee of £ 1 + fee for fitting machinery on board £ 3- 9-, + expenses in connection therewith £ 0-15-, total £ 5- 4- or £ 62,40.
