Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that the case of your steamer "CHRYSSOULA" referred to in your letter of the 25th ultimo was submitted to the Committee at their meeting on Friday last, together with the report of partial survey held on this vessel at Amsterdam during the past few months.

The Surveyors' report details their recommendations for hull and machinery, and as these were concurred in by the Principal Surveyor for Holland as being essential for class maintenance, your refusal to carry them out has given the Committee no option but to expunge the vessel's class from the Register Book with a black line indicating that from reported defects she is no longer entitled to retain her character.

The list of repairs effected to the vessel at Newcastle, of which the Society was aware, is returned herewith.
