the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners' Agents, King Bros., Victoria, B. C., attend on board the S.S. "CRYSTAL PARK", 7161 tons gross register of Montreal, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated sustained due to striking Assembly Wharf, Nanaimo, B. C., at time of departure on voyage to Victoria, B. C. on May 13th, 1944.

For further particulars see vessel's official Log Books.

Copy of extract from Note of Protest, dated 14th May, 1944, at Victoria, B. C. :-

"On May 13th, 1944, at 10.09 p.m. as the vessel was backing out from the Assembly Wharf, Nanaimo, the bracket of Starboard 'A' frame of paravane gear touched the wooden piling of the Wharf causing damage to the paravane bracket. Damage to the Wharf, if any, unknown."

On May 14th, 1944, while the vessel was lying afloat at Messrs. Victoria Machinery Depot Co. Ltd. Plant No. 2, Victoria, B. C., the undersigned upon examination, -

FOUND

Paravane "A" bracket, Starboard side, lower bracket support for shaft bearing distorted and broken away from shell plating where electric welded.

RECOMMENDED

Bearing bracket to be renewed. Surface fracture to be veed out and built up by electric welding.

This Certificate is issued upon the terms of the Rules and Regulations of the Society, which provide that:


FOUND

Small surface fracture in
shell plate at edge of welding
in way of same.

RECOMMENDED

The repairs as recommended were carried out by the
Victoria Machinery Depot Co. Ltd., Victoria, B. C., and
satisfactorily completed about 4.00 p.m., 14th May, 1944,
and the vessel proceeded on her intended voyage.

A report has been forwarded to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, stating that all the repairs
have been satisfactorily carried out and recommending that the
vessel be continued as previously classed.
