On the 15th September we could contact by phone the Manager, Mr. Tortora, who stated that probably the Society's Class would have not been maintained, but that a final decision to this respect had not yet been taken by the Owners. He promised to give us a written final reply on Thursday 20th instant, but this date elapsed and no reply was received from him. We have phoned again to-day to Mr. Tortora, but we were told that he is now out of Italy and that he will not be back before the end of next week. In his
