 and subsequently for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and  
 extent of damage, stated to have been caused due to striking a floating  
 object in the river Humber on the 2nd March, 1960. For further particu-  
 lars see log books.

On examination the following damage was found and repairs recommended  
 without prejudice to the terms and conditions of insurance:-

FIND

In engine low pressure crankpin  
 loose in after web.

Cracks in main engine bed plate in  
 way of column of L.P. cylinder

It is also recommended that the main shafting be aligned as necessary.

The foregoing recommendations are made with a view to placing the ma-  
 chinery in the same good and efficient condition as before the alleged  
 casualty occurred.

RECOMMENDED

Crank throw to remove and new  
 pin to fit. Throw to test for  
 truth in lathe

To repair with Metalock and fit  
 with strengthening doublers.
