slight indication of fire on 8th January 1948 in the lower part of the
completely full cross bunker and which apparently was now extinguished

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed

as 100 A1 without fresh record of survey subject to the structure of the
cross bunker being examined internally when the coal has been used from

being fit to carry dry and perishable cargo.

The vessel's class is also subject to permanent repairs to stem plating first opportunity; to repairs to indented plating etc. (p & s) and to S.W. repairs to shell plate B 7 (s.s.a) being specially examined next docking.
