S.S. "HOLMDALE"

S. I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 27th ultimo, and with regard thereto I have to inform you that this vessel was built by the Dublin Shipbuilding Ltd., in 1921 and classed 0100A1.

The vessel's character was withdrawn from the Register Book in February, 1930, and three dots (...) inserted in lieu, indicating withdrawal of class at the Owners' request.

In order to have her character re-instated in the Register Book, it will be necessary for the requirements of a Periodical Special Survey (D) to be complied with, which includes the drilling of the shell plating midships and in the vicinity of the peaks, and in such parts of the structure where signs of wastage are evident.

Any major repairs which have been effected to the structure since the vessel was disclassed will require to be specially examined in order to ascertain the character of the workmanship. Details of any structural alterations which have been effected since the vessel's class lapsed should also be forwarded.

Full particulars of the equipment on board will require to be furnished.

The original thicknesses of the shell plating as per attached form are forwarded for your guidance.

In addition a complete Special Survey of the machinery, boilers, electrical equipment and screw shaft should be held.
