The Second Special Survey No. 1 became due on this Steam Trawler in September 1923, and action has been deferred by the Classing Committee from time to time in view of the vessel being laid up, the late Owners having furnished the usual undertaking.

The Liverpool Office were recently informed by the late Owners that the vessel had been sold to Messrs. Hampshire, Birrell & Co. Ltd. The late Owners added that the new Owners' representative had been informed that the vessel "had not gone through her last Lloyd's survey".

In reply to inquiry, the new Owners state that at the time they bought the vessel they were not fully aware of her position as regards classification. They add that in the meantime she has already gone to sea, and is fishing out of the Faroe Islands, and they would esteem it a favour if the Committee would see their way to extend the period of grace for say six months, when they would carry out the overdue survey.

The case received the consideration of the Classing Committee on Friday, the 16th instant, when, in view of the vessel having gone to sea without survey and of the year of grace having expired in September last, the Committee decided to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line (~~1,25~~), indicating non-compliance with the Rules, and the Owners have been informed accordingly.
