Osaka Shosen Kaisha, Dairen, attend on board the motor vessel "KWANTO MARU" of Kobe, on October 3rd & 5th as she lay at the South Manchuria Railway Company's Wharf and Jijiko Pier, to examine and report on the Port and Starboard After Deep Tanks (Nos 3 & 4) for the purpose of carrying a shipment of Bean Oil in bulk for America.

On examination of the deep tanks internally, they were found to require wiping up where residue and moisture had collected, having been tested and cleaned in Japan prior to the vessel for Dairen. After the deep tanks had been cleaned as recommended by me they were passed fit to load on October 5th, 1930, at 7.00 A.M.

I hereby certify that the Port and Starboard After Deep Tanks (Nos 3 & 4) of the motor vessel "KWANTO MARU" of Kobe, were clean and free from paint, rust, scale, residue and moisture and in good condition and fit to receive a shipment of Bean Oil in bulk for America, all bilge and tank suction having been blanked off.
