In reply to your letter of 17th inst. I have to state that my survey of the vessel was confined to the items mentioned in the Qbc. Rpt. 1849A (being those parts of which I was advised by N. Yk. that they remained for completion of the survey) and to the filling in on the first entry report of the scantlings etc., not filled in by the New York Surveyors.

The statement that Section 48 of the Rules had been complied with, is the New York Surveyors and not mine.

I am of the opinion that the vessel should have notation of S.S. No. 3 provided the mast wedges were removed, and lining (if any) in way of sidelights was removed by the New York Surveyors, or if this was not done by them, the vessel is worthy of the notation S.S. No. 3 subject to these items being noted in the special reasons list for examination at the next Special Survey.

From my memory of a general examination of the vessel, the outside plating in way of the sidelights had no lining, and was

open to view and in good condition, but I was not required by the Secretary New York to survey these parts, and there may have been a few rooms with lining below the sidelights.

The vessel at the time of my survey was in good and well preserved condition.
