Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 13th instant enclosing a debit note for £4-4-0 being the amount of fees due in respect of a survey held at Aberdeen in November last on the Steam Trawler "SAVARIA", together with copies of correspondence in connexion therewith, we beg to acquaint you that the writer, in an interview to-day with the Owner, explained fully the provisions of the Society's Rules and Regulations applying to the attendance of the Surveyors when repairs are being carried out to a classed vessel. Also, that under the Society's Rules all survey fees require to be paid in order to entitle the vessel to retain her class in the Register Book.

Mr. Croft stated that he was not aware that the vessel was classed in this Society when he purchased it from Mr. Baker, the previous Owner.

He further stated that he was unable to settle the question of payment of the account until the meeting of his co-directors of The Croft Steam Fishing Co. Ltd., which would take place in the course of the present month and requested that a representative of the Society should attend the meeting to explain the position.

The documents enclosed with your communication are retained pending your further instructions in the matter.
