Dear Sirs,

With reference to your reports Nos. 10797 and 10802 on the Trawlers "JOHN COOPER" and "JOSEPH GORDON" respectively, re-conditioning for the Minesweepers Co-operative Trawling Society, I have to inform you that the total inclusive fees in these cases will be £22:1:0.

In accordance with the arrangement made with the Admiralty, an account for £15:15:0 has now been rendered, and the balance of £6:6:0 in each case will be applied for when the vessels have been placed in drydock for the final coating of the bottom and the placing on board of the stores. Your account will be credited with the above fees on payment, and you will be good enough to see that the necessary entries are now made in your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.

In the event of these vessels leaving your port without the surveys being completed as stated above, you should at once advise me to this effect.
