Description - Single angle.

Longitudinal No. 4604

Proportions -  $\frac{\text{Length}}{\text{Depth}} = 9.26$ .

Sheerstrake .50" instead of .36" as required.

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This vessel was built under the survey of the British Corporation to plans mutually approved by this Society and the British Corporation for the "Castle" class trawlers.

Reports have now been received from the Southampton Surveyors, giving particulars of scantlings, equipment etc. and these appear generally to be in accordance with approved plans.

The vessel has been examined in dry dock, the requirements of a special survey No.3 carried out, and some repairs effected.

It was not considered necessary to drill the shell plating.

The workmanship appears to be good.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to be classed:-
