A Managing Owners' Representative examined the I.P. cylinder  
liner and piston of the Steel Screw Steamer "Lennop" 4972 tons  
gross of London, on the 24th March 1920 and subsequent dates,  
that lying afloat in Barry Docks.

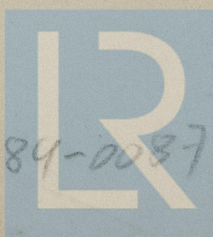
The I.P. cylinder liner has now been bored true and a new piston  
rod fitted.

The main steam pipes to superheaters have been removed at the  
Superintendent's request, and have now been replaced with copper  
pipes leading direct from the Main Stop valves to the main  
steam line.

Steam pipes were tested by hydraulic pressure to 440 lbs and  
found tight and satisfactory.
