Gentlemen:

At about 11 p/m last night there was delivered to me at the Hotel Americano Telegram No.234, being a code message from London to "Register", Curacao.

This message was despatched from London on the 9th. inst., in reply to a message sent by me to London on the 8th. inst.

On the 15th. inst., no reply to my message having been received, I again sent a message to London which was replied to on the 16th. by Telegram No.207, a message of 9 words. In this message of the 16th. I was informed that a reply to my original message of the 8th. had been sent on the 9th. This is the message delivered to me last night.

I shall be glad to have an explanation as to the cause of the delay in the transmission of Telegram No.234, delay which has caused much inconvenience.

I also wish to point out that the non delivery of this message resulted in further expense, Fls.6.40 (the cost of my message of the 15th.) and the cost of a nine word reply from London, expense which, in my opinion, this Society should not be required to pay.
