and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as now classed with fresh record of survey 12,46, and notation "Examined, Hull, 12,46" (12 months), subject to permanent repairs to starboard hawse pipe and plating in way at first convenient opportunity, as previously recommended, being fit to carry her usual cargoes.

The class of the vessel is also subject to one length of anchor cable being supplied at the first opportunity.
