This vessel is reported in Lloyd's List to have grounded twice at Sydney (C.B.). Heavy weather was experience on the voyage when Nos. 2 & 4 tanks leaked.

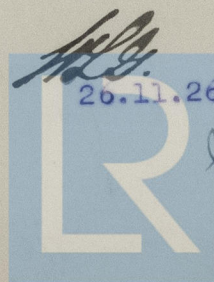
The Owner in September last informed the Bergen Surveyor that the vessel was due back in Europe about the end of October and hoped the Boiler Survey due 4,26 might be postponed until then, which proposal was approved.

The vessel arrived at Antwerp on the 16th instant, and in reply to enquiry the Surveyors state they got into touch with the Agents who approached the Captain regarding the Boiler Survey but the survey has not been held, and the vessel was due to leave that port on the 22nd instant for Cap Race for orders.

It is submitted the Owners be communicated with regarding the foregoing matters, and asked to state also when an opportunity will be afforded for the vessel to be examined on account of the reported grounding, and what steps they propose to take with a view to the Boiler Survey (which became due so long ago as April last) being held.
