FOUND

Three blades of solid cast iron propeller broken

RECOMMENDED

Broken propeller to be removed. Screw shaft to be drawn for examination, taken to the shop and tested in a lathe. A new cast iron propeller to be made and fitted to cone of the shaft. The screw shaft & propeller to be afterwards re-fitted in place and left in good working condition.

These recommendations were made for the purpose of placing the machinery of this vessel in as good condition as before the damage in question was sustained.
