(Shipbuilders) Ltd., Walker on Tyne, on 30th October 1933, in order to examine the Keel plating aft in No. 6 double bottom tank where some broken cement had been observed. The structure of the ship was found to be undamaged and I will accordingly transmit to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report recommending that the vessel be continued in her present Class, viz :- * 100A.1, with freeboard, subject, as at present, to "Nos. 1 & 2 Keel plates forward being faired at Owners' convenience", and the vessel being fit to carry her usual cargoes.
