ANSWER.

Date: February 28th, 1941

In reply, I have to state that your inquiry of the 31st July last was replied to under date of 16th December 1940 in which it was stated that the vessel had been bought by Mr. Pappadakis of the American Ship Brokerage Corp. of New York City, and it was his intention to have her repaired and reclassified with this Society.

She left this port on 10th December under tow to New York where she was examined in drydock, but it is understood owing to the amount of repairs necessary, the new Owner did not proceed with any work.

On 14th January 1941, we received a letter from the Rio de Janeiro Surveyor stating that the vessel had been bought by Mr. Henrique Lage of the Cia Nacional de Navegacao Costeira and that it was his intention for the vessel to be reclassified with this Society.

Mr. Eaglesome further stated that the work was to be done at the Salisbury Shipbuilding and Yacht Co., Salisbury, Md; as this is a very small repair yard and not capable of taking a vessel of this size, we wrote Mr. Eaglesome advising him so and up to the present, as far as we know, there have been no further developments.
