In reply to an enquiry the Bordeaux Surveyor forwards a letter received from the Owner in which he states "I am not thinking of continuing the class of the vessel in your Register owing to the excessive cost of your fees calculated at the rate of English exchange.

"In any case the class continues up to the 31st October next according to the 1921 certificate and the boiler was tested last "June".

It is submitted the vessel's class be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu indicating withdrawal of class at the Owner's request.


