'KILINSKI' ex 'MEXICAN VICTORY'

I duly received your letter of the 3rd instant enclosing a copy of one from the Gdynia-America Shipping Lines, Ltd., in connection with the proposed classification with this Society of the above ship, and I have also received your cablegram of the 10th instant reading as follows:-

'KILINSKI EX MEXICO VICTORY FORWARD SPECIMEN
FIRST ENTRY AND RELEVANT INFORMATION PER
CIRCULAR 1871'.

This is an American built "Victory" ship, and I have to draw your attention to Circulars 1871 and 1888, also circular letter dated 23rd May, 1946 (copy of which is enclosed) which will apply in this case.

At the same time, I enclose copies of plans of midship section and shell expansion (please return these in due course), also typical First Entry Report. A copy of C.11 Freeboard Report is being forwarded to you under separate cover.

The normal power of the turbines of this type of vessel is 8500 S.H.P., and copies of the First Entry Reports on the engines and boilers for machinery of this type are being made and will be forwarded to you shortly, together with a photostat copy of one line diagram of the electric power system and a copy of a First Entry Report on the electrical installation of a 'Victory' ship.
