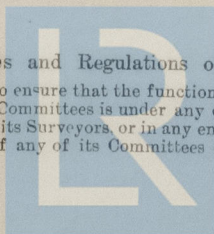
Surveyed the S.S. "KILINSKI", 7612 tons gross, of Gdansk, on the
